Scrap Happy Strip-Pieced Coasters

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What you need:

- 6-inch square of Insulbrite or batting, (piece scraps by zigzagging or using a scrap of fusible interfacing to join them together)
- Strips of scrap quilting cotton, 1 to 2 inches wide, the longest you need is 9", the rest are shorter, and as you can see, triangles can be used, too.
- 2 pieces for the back, same or different, 6" x 6 ½", pressed in half with wrong sides together, resulting in 2 rectangles 6" x 3 ¼".

Let's Sew:

- 1. Draw a diagonal line across the shiny side of the Insulbrite (mine is pieced) or one side of the batting.
- 2. Place 2 9-inch-long strips with right sides together, then one edge along the line you drew in step 1 as shown.
- 3. Sew through all layers ¼ inch away from the raw edge, then flip the top strip so the right side shows.
- 4. Press. Or finger press.
- 5. Continue adding shorter strips until your square is covered.
- 6. Turn it over and trim the strips even with the batting.
- 7. Pin each of the folded backing pieces to the front of the coaster, having the raw edges even and the fold near the center. They will overlap by about ½ inch at the center.
- Using ¼ inch seam allowance, sew all the way around through all layers.
- 9. Trim the corners as shown, then turn right side out, pushing the corners out with a point presser carefully.
- 10. Press well.
